

## **CHARLOTTE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE COLLECTION, 1892-2005**

### **ABSTRACT**

The Charlotte Chamber of Commerce was formed in 1876 by civic-minded Charlotteans who were interested in helping further the growth of Charlotte. Located today at 330 South Tryon Street, it is a membership based, volunteer-led organization, whose current mission is to “create competitive advantage by growing the economy, advocating pro-business public policies, and delivering innovative programs and services.” Historically, the Chamber has succeeded in paving and building Charlotte streets, led the push to integrate local businesses, advocated to bring in and expand transportation infrastructures, and supported the attraction and expansion of sports teams in Charlotte, among many other achievements.
