ABSTRACT

The Mint Museum of Art is internationally known for its dedication to collecting, conserving, exhibiting, inspiring, publishing, and protecting important works of art and design. The Mint was established in 1936, at 2730 Randolph Road, which once housed the Charlotte Mint. It was the first art museum in North Carolina. Today, it is known as the Mint Museum Randolph. The second Mint Museum, the Mint Museum of Craft + Design, also known as the Mint Museum Uptown, opened in 1999 at 500 South Tryon Street.
